

MOVING FORWARD IN FAITH

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Remember the story of the two sisters, Mary and Martha, who are entertaining their guest and friend, Jesus? (*Luke 10:38-42*)

Martha is frantic with business... clean the house, prepare the meal, be the perfect host. Mary, on the other hand, is primarily focused on sitting with Jesus, and listening to him and learning from him.

Martha is a bit miffed at her sister. "Mary, I'm doing all the work here, while you just sit there. How about a little help in the kitchen?"

And then, there are those words from Jesus, words of tenderness for Mary and words of reproach for Martha. "Martha, you're too preoccupied. Mary is doing the important thing. She is sitting with me, and listening to me." You can almost hear him saying, "Martha, I didn't come to see your clean house or eat your perfect meal, as good as those things are. I came to visit you! But so far, you've spent almost no time actually talking with me!"

Do we ever become so busy with the urgent work of the church that we ignore Jesus?

Don't get me wrong. There is much work to do, and the church benefits greatly from dedication and hard work. But why? Why do we do the work? Why keep the building in good shape? Why hold all the meetings? Why do we do all the things we do here?

Isn't it to provide a setting in which we, and others, might experience the presence of our Lord? If so, then it seems to me that we should be attentive to the most important work of it all... the work of nurturing our relationship with God in Jesus Christ. If we do not do that, how can we assist others in knowing Christ? If we do not do that, why are we here?

I wonder what it would be like... how we would experience church differently... how we would BE different, if we recommitted ourselves to the primary task, the "one thing needful," of tending to our faith together.

And so I offer to you a modest proposal.

If, at EACH gathering, whether a committee, a fellowship group, a class, or a work crew...

- Those present began with a few minutes of reading the Bible together, and reflecting on its meaning for us,
- and if they then spent a few moments in prayer, lifting up the names of those in the church, and in our lives, who need prayer, and also praying for each other and for the ministry of our church,
- and then attended to the purpose for the gathering, be it work or fellowship, or committee business

- and finally, before parting, if they reflected for just a few moments on how what they have spent their time doing advances our ministry together as the Body of Christ,

and then closed with prayer...

Finance Reports

August 2018 Sale of Property Fund Update

Due to the accumulated overage in the General Fund since January 2017, the finance committee decided to move \$35,000 from the General Fund to the Sale of Property fund that was created when Realty USA purchased the parcel of land to build their new offices. The overage in the General Fund comes from the fact that St. Michael's is currently not paying a full-time pastor's salary and benefits.

Here are the current figures for the Sale of Property Fund, as of June 30, 2018:

Opening Value on January 1, 2018: \$138,202.86

Cash deposited June 26, 2018: \$35,000.00

Gain/Loss since January 1, 2018: -\$2,252.68

Closing Value on June 30, 2018: \$170,950.18

Social Statement

THE UPSTATE NY SYNOD HEARING FOR THE ELCA SOCIAL STATEMENT ON WOMEN AND JUSTICE

The Upstate NY Synod Hearing for the ELCA Social Statement on Women and Justice will be held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Liverpool, on Saturday, Sept. 8 at 10 AM. The purpose of this hearing is to gather concrete feedback about the language and content of the Statement. Whereas the meetings on this Social Statement held at Atonement Lutheran Church over the summer were in depth discussions, this hearing is simply to gather the input of members through process questions. Two members of the task force will lead the hearing. All comments will be taken into consideration by the task force as it prepares the Statement for adoption at the Churchwide Assembly in 2019. It is exciting that we are able to have a voice in the preparation of this Social Statement on Women's Justice.
